



Size: UK 10 – US 6 – EU 36
oversize. **Skill Level:** advanced

How much yarn: 11 balls (each ball 25g and 212m) of **Silk Mohair** yarn (75% Superkid Mohair, 25% Silk) whose 7 balls shade no. 30481 beige, and 1 ball for each of four following shades: no. 30139, no. 30482, no. 30142, no. 30143

Needles: A 4.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable

A 4.50mm circular needle with 100cm cable

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

Other items: Stitch-markers

STITCHES

Using needles: K2, P2 rib

CIRCULAR STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): all rounds K.

FAIR ISLE STOCKING STITCH: work in stocking stitch, following Chart and Key. Use a ball for each colour, twisting yarn on WS to avoid holes when changing colours.


TENSION

19 sts and 26 rounds measure 10cm square over circular stocking st with 4.50mm circular needle and double yarn. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.


INSTRUCTIONS work using two strands of yarn held together

Note: work jumper in one piece, starting from neck-edge and working "top-down". **Yoke:** using 4.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable and no. 30481 cast on 109 sts and, making sure that sts aren't twisted, join to work in the round as follows: slip 1st stitch from right needle to left needle, then pass last st over slipped st: 108 sts remain. Place stitch-marker on right-hand needle to indicate round beg. For **neck border** work 8 rounds K2, P2 rib (corresponding to 2.5cm). Cont to work as follows: **1st round with incs:** * K3, M1 (=pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and knit into the back of it: 1 st increased), K3; rep from * to end: there are 126 sts. **2nd, 3rd and 4th rounds:** work in circular stocking st, without inc. Cont to work circular in Fair Isle st st, keeping in mind that the diagram shows the rounds with the increases BUT that the increases are not represented on the diagram. Work the rounds with the increases as follows: **8th diagram round (round with incs):** * K1, M1, K1; rep from * to end: there are 189 sts. **31st diagram round (round with incs):** * K2, M1, K1; rep from * to end: there are 252 sts. **Note:** when the number of stitches makes it necessary, take the circular needle with 100cm cable. When 46 rounds have been worked from border, cont to work in circular stocking st only with beige yarn as follows: **47th diagram round:** (round with incs) K, inc 54 sts evenly. There are 306 sts. Cont to work in circular st st and, when 58 rounds (corresponding to 22cm) have been worked from border, divide work. Cont to work only sts of Body and leave unworked the sts

of each sleeve as follows: work 95 sts for Front, cast on 4 new sts for armhole, leave unworked next 58 sts for 1st Sleeve, work 95 sts for Back, cast on 4 new sts for armhole, leave unworked next 58 sts for 2nd Sleeve. Join the work in round.

Back and Front: cont to work circular stocking st on 198 sts obtained and, when 59 rounds have been worked, corresponding to 22.5cm from Back and Front beg, work 7 rounds in Fair Isle stocking st, following the relevant diagram

for **lower border**. At end of diagram, for rib border, work 8 rounds K2, P2 rib (corresponding to 2.5cm). Cast off loosely in rib.

Sleeves: for each sleeve, using 4.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable pick up 4 sts from 4 cast on sts for armhole of Back and Front and cont

to work on 58 sts left unworked: there are 62 sts. Work in circular stocking st. When 108 rounds have been worked, corresponding to 41.5cm from Sleeve beg, dec 22 sts evenly across next round, then, for Cuff, work 8 rounds K2, P2 rib (corresponding to 2.5cm). Cast off loosely in rib.

Note: wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.
